

# Oxford Round Table

The Oxford Round Table is a nonprofit educational organization chartered in England and Wales as a forum for discourse concerning matters of public importance and academic interest. The Round Table was established over twenty years ago at St. Peter's College in the University of Oxford. Since that time, sessions have been held annually or semi-annually in several colleges of the University of Oxford. The primary college locations are Exeter, Lincoln, Pembroke, St. Anne's and Harris Manchester. The formal academic meetings, in which participants present and discuss papers, are normally held at the Oxford Union Debating Society, the University Examination Schools, or in the halls of the colleges. Each Round Table session engages a small interdisciplinary group of scholars to examine the various aspects of a given topic. Presentations of papers and dialogue in the formal meetings are facilitated by academics from Oxford or from other major universities. Some of the Facilitators are pictured below.
